These plans have been developed by Bradley Beach Elementary School District to be used in the event of a health related school closure ordered by the State of New Jersey Department of Health, the Monmouth County Health Department and or other relevant agencies.

In the event of a health-related school closure, the Bradley Beach School District has developed and will implement an action plan for continuation of learning.

Instructional Plan

All students, both SE & Regular Education, grades K-8 will have access to a minimum of two hours per day of home instruction, as per district home instruction policy.

Approximate breakdown of weekly instruction minutes:

- ELA - 2 hrs
- Math - 2 hrs
- SS - 2 hrs
- Science - 2 hrs
- Specials - 2 hrs

Technology Distribution

Chromebooks will be made available to students who indicate a need for a device to complete digital learning assignments in grades 4-8.

In the event school closure occurs after dismissal, the Chromebooks will be available for pick-up by parents outside of the school the following weekday.

Students in grades 4-8 who do not have Wifi capabilities at home will be provided a paper packet of the same material students are completing digitally.

Students will also be informed of the availability of computers and Wifi access at the Bradley Beach Public Library, 511 4th Ave, Bradley Beach, NJ 07720.

Instructional Plan Grades PK-3

Teachers in grades PreK-3 will prepare at least 10 days of materials that will be distributed to students and their families either in person, through email, or at the school distribution site. These materials and assignments will be differentiated for various learning styles and will be supported through the use of email contact with the teachers.

PreK-3 packets will have varied activities such as the incorporation of weekly readers, Envision 2.0 workbook pages,

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Special Education Instructional Plan PK-8

Related Arts Instructional Plan K-8

“Special” area teachers will work with General Education teachers to integrate into the work or they can develop grade specific materials for students to complete

Communication with School Community

Communication with parents and students about the schedule will be sent home via letter as well as Honeywell phone message.

Teachers will be available to communicate with 4th-8th grade students via google classroom, email, and other digital formats within G Suite.

Teachers in grade PK-3 will be available for support and communication with parents via email. Teachers will also post additional information on their teacher web pages.

Instructional materials will be sent home with all students in the event we have advanced notice of a closure. In the event we are forced to close

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after school hours, instructional materials will be made available for pick up outside of the school building by parents.

Special Education and Related Services

In-class resource special education teachers will work with regular education teachers to make sure specific accommodations and modifications are made to any assigned work in accordance with student's IEPs, including but not limited to differentiated digital instructional tools or modified instructional paper packets. The special education teachers will be available to parents via email communication for guidance and questions. This correspondence will provide suggested accommodations, modifications, and targeted supports.

Our pull-out resource replacement students will have specialized packets created by their special education teacher, including specialized materials required according to their IEP. The special education teacher will be available to parents via email communication for guidance and questions. This correspondence will provide suggested accommodations, modifications, and targeted supports.

Any services, such as occupational therapy, speech and language therapy, and physical therapy not received during a health related school closure will be provided with compensatory related services according to their Individualized Educational Plan upon the return to the regular school day.

Staff and Attendance Requirements

Depending on the nature of the school closure, essential staff may be required to report to work. These groups may include but are not limited to:

1. Central administration;
2. Building administrators and supervisors;
3. Teaching staff/certificated staff;
4. Support staff;

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5. Business office personnel;
6. Custodial staff;
7. Child nutrition staff.

Food Service

Students receiving free and reduced lunch services will be provided a bag breakfast and bag lunch during a health related school closure. Breakfast and lunch will be picked up at the designated location for meal distribution.

The district will work with Maschio's Food Service to determine a delivery location for meal distribution. This location would most likely be at the school.
